

Monday 16th March 2020

Dear Parents and Carers,

As I'm sure you will appreciate, we are currently dealing with a complex and rapidly changing situation. I would like to take this opportunity to reassure you that I am receiving daily updates from the Department for Education (DfE), Public Health and the Local Authority and acting upon any advice given.

My first priority will always be the health and safety of the pupils and staff in our school. Now, more than ever, this remains our primary focus.

In school, we have already taken the following measures:

- Teachers have spoken to all of the children about the importance of handwashing. Children are being directed to thoroughly wash their hands on a regular basis, whilst in school, along with other good hygiene routines such as not touching their face and using tissues, which can then be thrown away. Hand sanitizer is also available in every classroom.
- We have been in regular contact with the Department for Education regarding individual circumstances as they arise and we will continue to follow the department's quidance.
- Our cleaners have been following the latest guidance ensuring all touch points are cleaned regularly.
- We have been checking where families have been returning from if they have travelled overseas.
- We have begun making plans for learning and vulnerable families should a closure be put

This is an entirely unprecedented situation and we are following official advice from the government via the Department for Education and Public Health England. This advice is evolving on a daily basis and we are monitoring and responding to it as it is published. This official advice will underpin all the actions we take.

Whilst I appreciate that there will be a wide range of different views about how we should be responding and what action should be taken, I hope you will appreciate that I am duty bound to follow the official advice from government.

In addition to the actions we have already taken, we have now decided to increase our response in order to reduce the number of people visiting our school and therefore reducing the risk of transmission. From Monday 16th March 2020 all non-essential visitors will not be permitted to enter our building. This means the following events will not take place in school until further notice:

- There will be no Showcase Assemblies until further notice.
- There will be no INSPIRE or LAMP sessions for parents until further notice.

- Parents Evening will be cancelled on Wednesday 18th March and Thursday 19th March 2020.
- All swimming lessons and school visits, including BC Tigers, will be cancelled until further notice.
- All after school/extra-curricular clubs, including Year 6 Boosters, will be cancelled until further notice. (Harvills' Fun Academy, Wrap Around Care, will remain open).

Whilst this may be upsetting for children and families, we are taking these measures to protect our school community as much as we can. I hope that parents and carers support and understand why we are having to do this given the circumstance is unprecedented and serious. We understand that the coming weeks will be challenging for everyone in our community. We

- Ensure that your contact details are up to date on School Gateway as this is the main form of communication with yourselves should we need to contact you if the situation changes.

 if you have any concerns. The phone number is 0800 046 8687. Opening hours are 8am 6pm, Monday Friday.
- If you have non-urgent issues, please telephone school 0121 5571034 rather than coming in to the school building. Please do not gather in the school's reception area.

The situation regarding Coronavirus is ever changing but, in the meantime, we will continue to work to provide your children with the best education possible whilst keeping their safety and well-being our priority.
