The Curriculum at Harvills Hawthorn Primary School The Intent, Implementation and Impact of our Curriculum – PSHE

Intent

Here, at Harvills Hawthorn, we value and are dedicated to the teaching of statutory PSHE to ensure high standards. We see PSHE as a fundamental part of school life and we believe that by developing our PSHE provision we can contribute to the quality of our children's lives, both within and beyond school. Today's children and young people are growing up in a rapidly changing world full of opportunities but with few guarantees. PSHE education is a school subject through which pupils develop the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to keep themselves healthy and safe and prepared for life and work in modern Britain. PSHE can impact on both academic and non-academic outcomes for all pupils developing their resilience, self esteem, risk management, team working and critical thinking. The many skills that are developed in these subjects can be transferred across the curriculum and thus aid learning.

Implementation

As a school and in accordance with the National Curriculum's expectations, and along with The PSHE Association's Programme of Study for PSHE education (key stage 1-2) we aim to ensure that all pupils:

- Are provided with a broad and balanced curriculum with learning grouped into three core themes:
 - health and wellbeing, relationships and living in the wider world (including economic wellbeing and aspects of careers education).
- Have an understanding of risk and are equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to make safe and informed decisions regarding their personal development, behaviour, welfare and safeguarding.
- Are taught weekly in timetabled lessons. Targets will be taught via Forest school for at least one half term per year
- Respect own and others values, ideas and beliefs.

- Have the opportunity to explore their attitudes and values.
- Are taught PSHE as a whole subject – from relationships and sex education to mental health, online safety to employability skills.
- Are taught by trained teachers with ongoing opportunities to learn through CPD.
- Will acquire the knowledge, understanding and skills they need to manage their lives now and in the future.
- Will have opportunities to reflect in circle time activities, class assemblies, whole school assemblies, P4C and through our values education.

Impact

Our children at Harvills will:

- be able to themselves judge whether they feel more confident or have a firmer sense of their own beliefs and opinions.
- know what a healthy relationship looks like.
- have a range of healthy relationships.
- contribute positively to our local community and the wider world.
- know why it is important to develop economic well-being.
- have aspirations for their current next steps and their future.
